It was with some trepidation that I assumed the Presidency. The achievements of those that have preceded me loomed large and daunting. With your help, this will be another great year for our club.

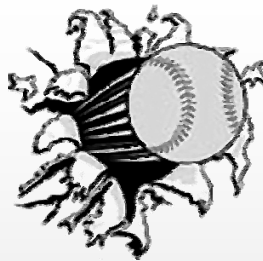
