



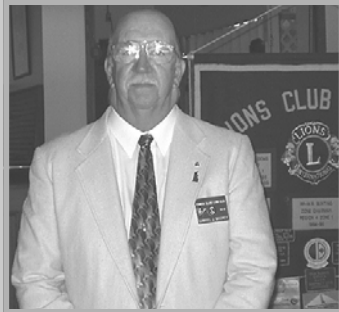

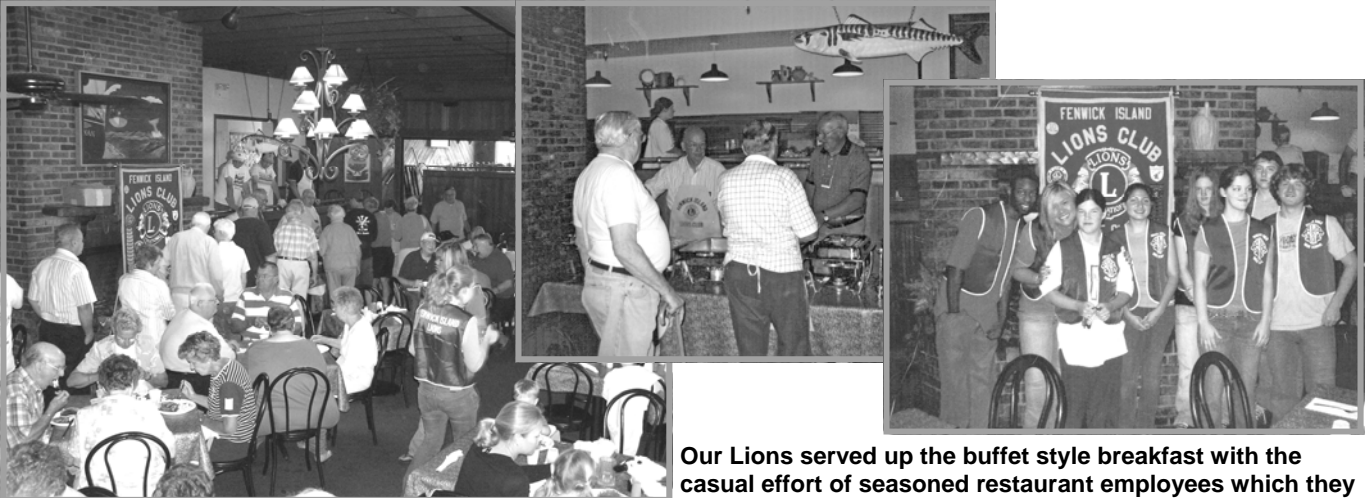

Aluminum Drink Can Collection Program: Single Largest Fundraiser for our Club!

The Fenwick Island Lions Club "Environmental Specialists" (in reality, aluminum can collectors) met recently to celebrate another successful year.

Believe it or not, the single largest, year around, fundraiser for the Fenwick Islands Lions Club is collecting and recycling aluminum drink cans. This past year, twenty plus members of the Club picked-up the equivalent of 8-48 foot long tractor trailer loads of cans from 15 locations scattered around the area, from Fenwick Island and Selbyville in the South to Bethany Beach, Ocean View and Millville in the North.

This program alone enabled the Club to donate just shy of \$9,000 to local charities, support its and the International Club's sight programs and help fund a college scholarship program that is awarded each year to Indian River High School seniors. Sam Mooney, President of the Fenwick Islands Lions Club recently commented that "I am very proud of the individuals who participate in this program. It is a lot of work and it is a dirty job, but over the years it has been a real success story for our Club. We have been collecting and recycling aluminum cans since 1987, when members Calvin Denis and Jay Downing began the program."

Please help the Fenwick Islands Lions Club reduce the amount of garbage going into our landfills, and at the same time, help others in the community and worldwide by contributing to its recycling efforts. Collection stations (lattice bins with the familiar Lions Club logo) are located at Fenwick Island Town Hall and Lighthouse Liquors in Fenwick Island, Marvin's Market and Willie's on Rte. 54, G & E in Ocean View, Grotto Pizza, Food Lion and Hocker's on Rte 26 (and hopefully soon at the new Giant shopping Center in Millville.) And please, no glass, plastic or other household trash!
