Membership Retention! In our Club no member

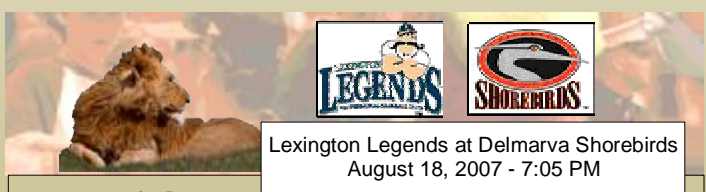

America's Second Harvest — secures and distributes more than 2 billion pounds of donated food and grocery products annually; and supports approximately 50,000 local charitable agencies operating more than 94,000 programs including food pantries, soup kitchens, emergency shelters, after-school programs and Kids Cafes.

The Food Bank of Delaware is a not for profit agency distributing food to the hungry throughout Delaware. It has been a member of "America's Second Harvest," since 1988. The Food Bank of Delaware distributes over 10 million pounds of food on an annual basis.

The "Hunger has a Cure" boxes, which contain basic but nutritious food, are offered by the grocery chain Food Lion for \$4.99 each and are part of "America's Second Harvest" program. The boxes are distributed locally by the Food Bank of Delaware.

Up Date: Oak Brook, IL, USA, July 9, 2007 — Lions around the world have rallied to raise funds for Campaign SightFirst II. Lions have now raised US\$105 million, leaving one-third of the total left to raise in the final year of the three-year Campaign.

Lions reached a major campaign benchmark by surpassing the US\$90 million Campaign SightFirst II (CSFII) goal well ahead of convention. Lions are on track to surpass the US\$150 million minimum goal to fight preventable blindness around the world.

"We have many millions of dollars still to raise, but the pace of fundraising is really increasing," said Dr. Tae-Sup Lee, Past International President and CSFII Chairperson. "Lions have always risen to the challenge and are prepared to continue their global leadership in the fight against blindness."
