We had exceptionally good speakers at both of our March meetings. On March 5th, John Culp, Deputy Director of the Sussex County Senior Services, CHEER Centers, came and told us all about the good things that his organization does for seniors in our area. Of course, our club already participates in the CHEER program by delivering meals on wheels. CHEER is an independent, private non-profit agency serving the needs of senior citizens in Sussex County. In addition to meals on wheels and mid-day meals at their centers, they provide numerous home services and transportation. Our club is proud to be a part of this program.

The speaker at our March 19th meeting was Dr. Jeffrey Hilovsky from the Sussex Eye Center. Dr. Jeff is the eye doctor that has been reviewing all of the photos that we and other Lions Clubs have been taking in the pre-school eye screening program that we have been participating in the last three or four years. This has amounted to from 1000 to 2000 photos per year and Dr. Jeff has done this free of charge. Based on Dr. Jeff's recommendations and follow-up examinations, numerous children have

received preventative care from potentially serious eye problems. Our club is proud to be a part of this program also.

However, Dr. Jeff didn't come to talk to us about the eye screening program. He came to tell us about his experience as a Commander in the Air Force National Guard at the Dover Air Force Base. In the olden days, the National Guard use to be a few weekends a month and two full weeks during the summer. That has all changed since the Iraq conflict. Although he does have a civilian practice, he is pretty much on call 24 hours a day, seven days a week. The Guard does have full time employees that he can call on for specific assignments. As Commander of the Medical Division, he has his hands full. But after his talk, I think I speak for most of our members in saying that the Guard is in pretty good hands. Incidentally, both of the speakers for March are fellow Lions.

One of the highlights of the meeting was the presentation of one of our own Club's Lion Awards to Dr. Jeff for his outstanding service to our club and the community. The Lion was made by the mentally and physically challenged individuals at the Stockley Center and handcrafted by our own PP Cal Denis.

Don't forget the Convention in Dover, Delaware, May 14 – 17th. If you can't attend all of the days, at least try to get there on Wednesday, May 16th. That is the day for the District 22D Luncheon. Lions Reach Half of Campaign SightFirst II Goal of US\$150 Million

Oak Brook, IL (USA) March 19, 2007 — Lions surpassed a major campaign benchmark by reaching more than US\$75 million raised, half of their Campaign SightFirst II (CSFII) minimum goal of US\$150 million to fight preventable blindness around the world.

With 15 months remaining in Campaign SightFirst II fund raising, Lions are keeping their focus on their ultimate goal: saving sight by raising funds to continue the SightFirst program.

"We have many millions of dollars still to raise, but reaching this half-way point is very encouraging and exciting for the thousands of Lions raising funds," said Dr. Tae-Sup Lee, Past International President and CSFII Chairperson. "Lions have always risen to the challenge and are prepared to continue their global leadership in the fight against blindness."
