Total attendance reached 976, nearly 300 more than last year's Convention in Virginia Beach. We should be able to reach 1,200 registrants easily, next year. So for those of you who attended, let's spread the word about how great the food was, how great the accommodations were and how great the Hotel and Food Service Staff were with the outstanding service provided to us.

We also "Shifted the Paradigm" this year in our Election, where for the first time anyone can remember, we ended up with a tie vote for the office of Vice District Governor. On the second ballot Lion Bob Daniels garnered 51% of the vote and was declared the winner. Congratulations go out to Lion Bob and Lion Guyla for a hard fought and very-clean campaign. Both Lions showed their knowledge of the Lions Code of Ethics in the Campaign conducted by both camps. For those keeping score, the Constitutional Amendments also passed by the required super majority.

Oak Brook, IL, USA, May 23, 2007 — Lions surpassed a major campaign benchmark by reaching the US\$90 million Campaign SightFirst II (CSFII) goal well ahead of convention. Lions are on track to surpass the US\$150 million minimum goal to fight preventable blindness around the world. Lions hoped to raise US\$90 million by the association's 90th anniversary and the 90th international convention but have met the goal nearly five weeks ahead of that date.

With 13 months remaining in Campaign SightFirst II fund raising, Lions are keeping their focus on their ultimate goal: saving sight by raising funds to continue the SightFirst program. "With each week, more and more Lions clubs are rallying around Campaign SightFirst II," said Dr. Tae-Sup Lee, Past International President and CSFII Chairperson . According to Dr. Lee, personal gifts from Lions and "Model Clubs" have and will continue to be the two major Lions' sources of fund raising. Gifts from public and governmental sources are also being sought and accepted through the campaign.
