This means our Club donated sufficient funds to this worthy project to qualify for inclusion in the top five clubs in our District 22 D. As some say... we are on a "glide path" to receive the same award for the 2007-2008 Lions Year based on our Club pledging a denotation over \$26 thousand to this worthy project. So far for 2006 year to date 2008 we have sent \$14, 542.28 to LCI for Campaign SightFirst II.

commitments for this project LCI reports in April that "The family of Mrs. Aruna A. Oswal has made the largest, single personal donation in Lions Clubs International Foundation's 40-year history by pledging a total of US\$3 million to Campaign SightFirst II (CSFII). Oswal is a member of the Lions Club of Juhu in Mumbai, India and is a Lions past district governor. In addition, she is a CSFII national fund-raising coordinator for India.

We here in the ol' Bulletin Editors office suspect we could do better. We have the time. This project ends, in the 2010-2011 Lions Year. Assuming CSFII stays with the \$400 minimum needed for a "Model Club Award" we only about \$5K additional funds for the outlying 2010-2011 Lions Year. Let's all think this over and between our Melvin Jones Awards and individual Lion members contribution we could complete the "deal"!

- "Three over three" — Designate one new Melvin Jones Fellowship (MJF) for CSFII each year for the next three years to save as many as 500 people from blindness

- Hold an additional club fund-raising event or activity and designate funds to CSFII

3. E-mail (csfii@lionsclubs.org) or call the CSFII office to share your club's success by May 23, 2008 so that your Campaign SightFirst II Day efforts for sight can be included in CSFII's final funds-raised total.

It is just one day and one action for you and your Lions club, but your club's Campaign SightFirst II Day activity has the power to provide a lifetime of sight to people who need Lions' help.


Leader Dog Meeting & Dinner – March 25:
