Campaign SightFirst II

The encore to the original SightFirst program, which itself was responsible for saving and restoring sight for millions of individuals, was concluded in June 2008—after a three year run. It produced, in cash and pledges, another \$200,329 million... far exceeding the original goal of \$150 million. Isn't it amazing what can be done when 45,000 Clubs worldwide—with 1.3 million members strong) all pull in the same direction?

What our Club did was no less remarkable. Through the leadership of Lion Sam Mooney, with the able assistance of his wife Lion Muriel, the energy & hard work of Martha Stone and the generosity of both our members and the community at large, to date, we have raised and contributed over \$15,000—more than any other Club in Delaware. And, our total pledges for this cause have come to more than \$27,000—the second highest amount pledged in

Under the leadership of 1st VP Lion Fran Pretty, the assistance of her good husband Lion Bob Pretty and our newest Club members Lion Dave and Lion Ann Jaeger... and the support of a large number of our members, this event is shaping up to be bigger and better than ever.

Not only do we have three high school bands participating in the parade, for the first time ever, WBOC, the TV station out of Salisbury, MD, will be doing live coverage of this event. And, preliminary indications are that this will be a financial success for our Club and the humanitarian service programs we support.
