Lion Luke Martin, a WWII Veteran and a Lion for the past 50 years, talked about his involvement in to preserve and share artifacts and stories of the 103rd Infirtry Division of the Army, to which he was a member. For the past 50 years there have been reunions. This year the reunion was in Hattisburg Mississippi where the University of Southern Mississippi's Museum collected all Luke's artifacts; 7 binders and 88 stories. The men of the 103rd trained at Camp Claybourne. The men served in France in the LaRogue Mountains. The next reunion will be in Dallas Texas.

GUEST SPEAKER

Bill Gay is a Veteran who has helped preserve our freedoms, by being involved with “Operation Seas the Day” and Habitat for Humanity. Bill thanked our club for the donation to Habitat which was used in the building of a house for the Gonzolas family. Mr. Gonzolas is a disabled Vet. They will move into their new home on Dec. 18. The way this works is....they will have a first and second mortgage, if they keep up payments and pay off the first mortgage the second mortgage is forgotten. There are two more veteran families waiting for their home. One will be ready in July of 2016 and the other in November of 2016. Habitat's goal is to have two houses ready for two families per year. Bill said “Contractors for a Cause” has agreed to build all the houses.
