It is hard to believe that we are quickly reaching the end of another year for our club. Looking back, it seems a bit of a blur. But, along with the blur, I think we can all take a great deal of pride and satisfaction, both as Lions and as a Club, because we continue to face the challenges and work for the good of the community making a positive difference in lives of those whose path we cross. And, along the way, we made time for some fun and great memories!

This year we awarded \$11,000 in scholarships to graduating seniors of Indian River High School, to help them defray some of their higher education costs. We worked with our Indian River High School LEO and at year's end, threw a "Thank You" picnic in their honor at Camp Barnes. We also cemented our relationship with Camp Barnes and have pledged substantial funds for some much needed restoration work at their extraordinary facility on Miller's Creek in Frankfort.

We successfully completed our 27th year of dedicated service to the Meals-on-Wheels program, delivering both nourishment and good cheer five-days a week throughout the year to homebound seniors.

Our youth vision screening team administered some 500+ eye exams to area 3-5 year olds, in an effort to detect childhood vision disorders at a stage where they are most treatable.


Collecting aluminum cans for recycling has once again contributed substantially to our treasury, solely for the benefit of our service projects.

Fenwick Lions Award \$10,000 in Scholarships to Indian River High School Seniors-

As they have each year since 1991, the Fenwick Island Lions Club has devoted a considerable percentage of its annual budget to awarding scholarships for area seniors graduating from the Indian River High School. This year the board of directors voted to 'ear mark' some \$10,000 for this purpose.

Bruce Schoonover, president of the club, pointed out that "...while our fundraising efforts have played a big part in our ability to be so generous, this year we also received over three thousand dollars from individual members and others who gave money to the club, specifically for our scholarship fund, in memory of past members, friends and spouses.

Two of the club's scholarships have been fully funded by the families of Skip Higgins and Harold Rabinowitz, who were both long time members of the club. A third one is provided in the memory of Jackie Simpson, the wife of the founder of the club.




