If you thought our last Bingo evening was fun, exciting and rewarding, wait till you see Martha Stone's latest idea for a fundraiser.

Where else can you spend between one and four quarters and have a chance to win a prize worth anywhere from \$10 to \$100?

The paddle party auction is the latest way to raise money and have an enjoyable evening with your friends.

Your \$10 admission buys you one numbered paddle and the chance to bid, with quarters. specially on selected award items, ranging from gift certificates, gas cards, to dinner for two and many, many more. Knowing, Martha, the prizes will be presented unique and beautifully!

### Fenwick Island Lions Club Awards \$10,000 in Scholarships to Indian River High School Seniors

At the April board meeting, the Fenwick Island Lions Club embraced the decision to increase the level and number of scholarships awarded to Indian River High School seniors. This was done in light of the economic times, the ever increasing cost of higher education and the importance of providing support to the youth of our community. The following scholarships were authorized. A \$4,000 scholarship named in honor of the long serving chairman of the Scholarship Committee—John Furlow, a \$1,000 scholarship in the name of the Club's founder Noble Simpson, and another one for \$1,000 honoring the memory of long time member Skip Higgins and his wife Ce. In addition to these three, and based on the club's financial strength, the board authorized an additional four \$1,000 scholarships.

This year the club received eleven applications from Indian River High School seniors and on May 1<sup>st</sup> the Scholarship Committee, consisting of John Furlow, Bob Pretty, Bruce and Sharon Schoonover, along with

Club President Jean Bertram interviewed the applicants. In awarding the scholarships, the committee considered academic standing, financial need, community service involvement, extracurricular activities and the applicant's ability to communicate. Commenting on the process, Club president Jean Bertram, speaking for all members of the committee, indicated how impressed she was, not only with the academic achievements of all the applicants, but how goal oriented and well rounded each and every one of the applicants was.

The winners were announced at the traditional Indian River High School Awards Ceremony on Wednesday May 23<sup>rd</sup>




