LEO Club Takes Lead on Literacy Initiative

Dovetailing with this year's Lions Clubs International literacy initiative, the LEO Club will be spearheading a community wide effort to collect children's books and place them in the hands of students at the Phillip C. Showell Elementary School in Selbyville. **The Club is asking for our help in this effort!**

Statistics show:

1 in 4 children grow up not knowing how to read!!!

2/3 of students who cannot read proficiently by the end of the fourth grade will end up in jail or on welfare. 85 percent of all juveniles who enter the juvenile court system are functionally illiterate.

Based on these statistics and many more like them, our LEO club has chosen a service project for the fall of 2012. We have decided to organize a book drive in our community hoping to gather as many elementary level books as possible! We have a large population of students who volunteer as mentors at Phillip C. Showell Elementary School in Selbyville, Delaware through our school's chapter of the National Honor Society. Our plan is to gather and separate books based on grade level appropriateness and have these students distribute them among the classes at that school.

We plan to have a box set up for collection at Indian River High School's annual open house, scheduled for August 29th. That box will then be located in the school's main office. Our hope is to gather enough books to truly build impressive 'libraries' in each of the classrooms at our target school so we would appreciate any help in collecting and gathering that the LIONs would be able to offer! If all goes well, this could become an annual project ultimately donating to each of the schools in our feeder program.
